


DISTRIBUTING HAPPINESS

TEACHERS' TRAINING

On the 4th and 5th of April, more than 25 senior teachers of SSN participated in the first educationoriented session held at Taki, West Bengal. Various subject-matter experts were invited to share their perspectives and discuss critical topics pertaining to education and teaching.

Ms Arna Seal spoke on the theory of change and stressed on the adaptation of the society's core beliefs by the staff members.

Ms Sreya Sen talked about English communication in the classroom.



Swapnopuron has always focused on the impact of teachers beyond the classroom walls. With this perspective, Swapnopuron Welfare Society (SWS) conducted an intensive *Teachers' Orientation Program*. The program was facilitated by eminent speakers and educationists who delivered lectures on integral topics related to holistic learning, incorporation of National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, reading readiness, learning outcomes and communication strategies.

Keeping the philosophy of experience-based learning at the heart of the month of May, the facilitators practised several hands-on learning activities in classrooms to involve children further in the learning process. Mr Parminder Singh and Ms Hema Biswas conducted a Teachers' Training Program to equip the teachers of SSN for better classroom engagement.

- Swapnopuron Welfare Society launched its newest branch school in Paschim Khejberia on May 7th, 2022. The design of the branch facilitates much more than a traditional school. It has a shelter home, a dispensary for medical support, a library as well as a potable water facility for the community.
- Swapnopuron is now on the fast track to building a new Early Education Center in Kalitola! This branch school is going to be one of its kind eco-friendly Green School. Based on a prototype borrowed from Bali, the entire structure is made from white-sand bags, bamboo and limestone.
- With the help of our construction partner Tega Industries, we intend to create an accessible and approachable learning experience for all the learners of the community. The school building will impact more than 2000 lives, and will be a building of 16,650 sq ft, with state-of-the-art facilities.



Impacting the Community!



Towards the end of May comes a very important event in the history of women empowerment – the celebration of World Menstrual Hygiene Day on the 28th of May. The members of SWS, along with many adolescent girls, celebrated this day at Kanchrapara under the Scheme for Adolescent Girls (SAG) and Kanyashree Programme (KP). More than 50 adolescent girls attended the sessions on yoga for fitness during menstruating days, taking care of oneself during this time, sessions on mental health and many more. At the end of the session, sanitary napkins were distributed to all the participants. As a part of this program, Swapnopuron would be expanding its reach to 4700 adolescent girls!



On 5th June, the passionate women of the council, accompanied by the SWS team, planted over 50 fruit trees on the premises of the school on World Environment Day. The Swapnopuron Team also planted over 50 more saplings across the village with the help of Twine Tales' donations.





On 6th June 2022, SWS initiated a new project - 'Swapnopuron Pathabhaban,' under which periodic after-school classes are conducted to provide additional academic support to the children of Shamshernagar (located on the Bangladesh border, on the edge of mangrove forests of the Sunderbans). More than 50 children from the nearest government schools, studying in grades 5 to 9, attend these afternoon sessions with gusto and enthusiasm. The facilitator of these classes is Mr Niranjan Mondal, who takes up different subject matters for discussion from Monday to Saturday.

SWS hosts periodic meetings and sessions with the guardians of the students to nurture positive interpersonal attitude and relationships between parents and children. Parents share the hopes and dreams and aspirations they have for their children, while exploring the hardships and challenges of their own lives; some parents even break down while talking about their difficult circumstances. Such cathartic group sessions help the local community immensely.
